The Office of the Australian Information Commissioner (OAIC) produced a suite of COVID-19 guidance materials to educate Australian government agencies, organisations and individuals about personal information handling practices during the pandemic.

#### b. Please provide a full description of the initiative (no more than 350 words)

At the start of the pandemic, the OAIC convened an internal COVID-19 privacy taskforce to provide dedicated privacy advice and guidance on COVID-19 matters. Since March 2020, the privacy taskforce has worked quickly and collaboratively to produce a suite of COVID-19 guidance materials to educate Australian Government Agencies, organisations and individuals about their privacy rights and obligations.

The guidance materials focus on key areas such as:

- assessing privacy risks in changed work environments;
- understanding privacy obligations towards staff during the pandemic;
- privacy rights and obligations regarding the Australian government's COVIDSafe app;
- privacy considerations regarding the collection of personal information for contact tracing purposes; and
- privacy rights and obligations regarding the collection, use, storage, and disclosure of employee health information related to the COVID-19 vaccine.

Key pieces of guidance relating to the Australian Government's COVIDSafe app were developed to accompany the legal framework of privacy protections that were established under Part VIIIA of the *Privacy Act 1988* (Privacy Act). In addition to educating regulated entities on their new obligations under the Privacy Act, the Guidance for individuals was translated in to 10 different community languages to ensure a broad cross-section of the community were educated about their privacy rights related to the COVIDSafe app.

# c. Please explain why you think the initiative deserves to be recognised by an award (no more than 200 words)

The OAIC worked collaboratively with a range of stakeholder to produce this suite of guidance materials, including Commonwealth government agencies and Australia's National COVID-19 Privacy Team (consisting of OAIC staff and state and territory privacy regulators). The OAIC also consulted with industry and privacy professionals who provided feedback to inform the development of the guidance.

The OAIC's guidance generated significant interest on the OAIC's webpage and social media channels. For example, the <u>Coronavirus (COVID-19): Understanding your privacy obligations to your staff</u> received over 50,300 views at the start of the pandemic. The OAIC's <u>Guidance for businesses collecting personal information for contact tracing</u> received over 24,000 views and the OAICs more recently developed <u>COVID-19</u> <u>Vaccinations: Understanding your privacy obligations to your staff</u> has received close to 7,000 views to date.
