chaired a CPDP panel -
"When Regulatory Worlds
Collide – the intersection
of Privacy, Competition
and Consumer Protection".
The EDPS participated in
the CPDP panel chaired by
OPC Canada, and another
by the Digital Clearing
House.
OPC Canada, UK ICO, OAIC
Australia, SIC Colombia
and U.S. FTC also
participated in the joint
ICPEN/GPEN Best Practices
webinars in February. The
event brought together
enforcement professionals,
from privacy and consumer
protection, and discussed

the survey will inform
updates to the Handbook.
